End of an Era

On Friday January 12th, 2024, Cassity Jones completed the asset sale of our Cassity Jones Bossier City location to Stine Lumber Company out of Sulphur, LA. This marked the closing of a chapter in Cassity Jones' history of owning a building materials facility in Louisiana.

In 2015, Cassity Jones acquired the assets of Allen Millwork, Inc., a Shreveport lumber and door mill operation whose history dated back to 1860. In 2019 we built a new facility in Bossier City and rebranded it as Cassity Jones Bossier City.

These are never easy decisions. The Bossier City location was a big part of the Cassity Jones family. However, after looking at our strategic vision for Cassity Jones and the market opportunities in Texas and Louisiana, we realized the best decision for the Bossier City operation, our employees, and their customer base was to sell to Stine Lumber.

Stine Lumber, like Cassity Jones, is a generational family-owned business that has been operating for over 70 years and the family-based values of each company are closely aligned. Stine is Louisiana's largest family-owned building materials dealer and employs over 800 associates in 12 stores across the state of Louisiana and one store in Natchez, Mississippi. Their proven track record and expertise in the building materials industry made them the ideal candidate to ensure the continued success of the Bossier City location.

This strategic decision allows us to streamline our operations and concentrate on our key markets, ensuring that we can deliver the best value to our customers. We are confident that Stine Lumber Company will not only maintain but enhance the level of service and product quality that our Bossier customers have come to expect.

We appreciate the dedication and hard work of our team members in Bossier City and are confident that this decision will contribute to the overall success and growth of their operation. We'll miss our Bossier City family members and we will never forget the great memories that we made together. They are now part of our storied company history and remain alumni that we will remember fondly.

Texas Growth

The annual population numbers are out, and Texas gained another 500,000 residents in 2023. Although this is less than what Texas gained in 2022, it still far exceeds what any other state gained during the past year. The annual growth adds up--in the past 10 years, Texas has gained over 4,000,000 people. To put that in perspective, there are over twenty states that do not have a total population of what Texas has gained in just the last ten years.

Within a month of you reading this, the new Cassity Jones Lumber location in west Fort Worth will be in full swing. This will be the lumber division's sixth location in Texas and is right in the middle of one of Texas's hottest growth spots, both current and in the future. This has the potential to be the lumber division's highest volume location, taking the company to a whole new level. Keep growing Texas—we're ready!

On an unrelated matter, this is an election year. Time to gear up for what can sometimes be tasteless political campaign ads! Party primaries have already started, with the Texas primary coming up on March 5, 2024, which is commonly referred to as Super Tuesday because many other states (12) will be having their primary on the same date. This is the part where I encourage you to let your voice be heard, and primaries are part of that process. The Texas primary is not just for the party presidential candidate(s), but also will include a Congressional senate seat (currently held by Ted Cruz), the Congressional and Texas House seat for your district, potentially a Texas Senate seat depending on your voting district, various State Board of Education seats, a Railroad Commissioner seat, State Appeal Court seats, and numerous local races. Party primaries are the start to getting to a winning candidate in the November general election. Don't let others decide for you who wins--get out there and vote!

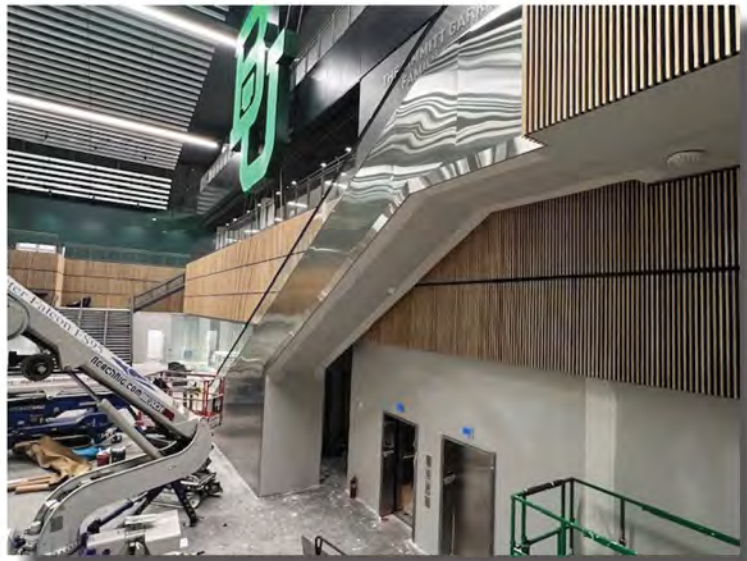

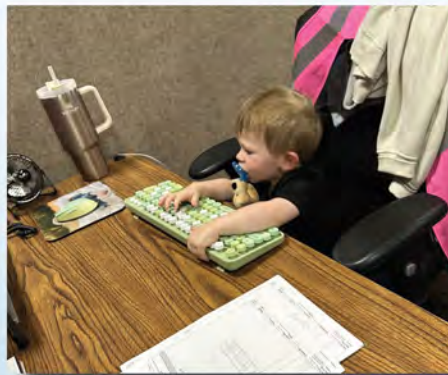
